COMPREHENSIVE CARE

Pain and Symptom Management

Our physicians and nurse practitioners provide expert medical care and work with your own provider or specialist to alleviate pain, manage symptoms, and ensure patient comfort.

Education

Our nurses skillfully gauge how the patient is doing, coordinate care with patient's doctor and hospice team, and teach caregivers how to care for patient.

Medications, Equipment, and Supplies

Our team coordinates the ordering, delivery, and set up of all necessary medication, medical equipment and hospice supplies, to your door, and at no cost to patient or family.

- Medications: all medications related to the patient's hospice diagnosis are provided.
- Medical equipment may include: hospital beds, bedside commodes, oxygen, nebulizers, over bed tables, shower chairs, wheelchairs, etc.
- Medical supplies may include: bandages and wound care supplies, briefs, pads, and other incontinence care supplies, gloves, oxygen tubing and other oxygen supplies, personal care products including soap, shampoo, body lotion and barrier creams, positioning devices including cushions and wedges, etc.

Emotional and Spiritual Support

- Our social workers provide counseling services for patients and families. They also provide advance care planning conversations and connection to other resources.
- Non-denominational spiritual care provided by chaplains in collaboration with local faith communities.

Family Support

- Respite care to give caregivers a needed break.
- Volunteer support and assistance with daily activities like running an errand, providing companionship for a patient, etc.
- Bereavement support and grief counseling for families.

Therapy Services

- Therapists of different disciplines support the hospice team by providing interventions that may extend the patient's level of independence, preserve their dignity, and create a safe environment for the patient and caregiver.
- Complementary therapies, like music therapy and pet companionship improve quality of life by reducing stress, anxiety and agitation while meeting the social, emotional, spiritual, and cognitive needs of the patient and family.

In-Home Care

- Skilled nursing care provided in the comfort of the patient's home.
- Assistance with personal care, like bathing and dressing, and other necessities.
- Crisis care to stabilize symptoms

Inpatient Care

- Access to hospice facilities for those needing intensive symptom management.
- Short-term care to stabilize symptoms before returning home.
